Proactive Approaches To Preserving AI:



Institutionally

- Comprehensive student, faculty, and staff orientations; ongoing education
- Co-create policies and procedures, inclusive of robust process steps and language
- Create and maintaine a communications campaign to advance culture and norms



Proactive approaches should not be compliance oriented, policing, or threatening.



Reflective questions to consider in designing proactive and reactive measures

- 1. Why do Al violations occur and what does honoring and living the six values look like?
- 2. What could be seen as violations and why are they considered to be so within the institution's cultural context?
- 3. What are the responsibilities of all parties to help prevent them?
- 4. What is the impact (at different institutional levels and on different members of the community) of not honoring the Al values?
- 5. What role is technology playing to help support AI and how can it be used appropriately by all parties?
