Academic integrity is about moving from ideals to action, and demonstrating and practicing these values. **It requires you to do something.**

1. Comprehensive student, faculty, and staff orientations; ongoing education
2. Co-create policies and procedures, inclusive of robust process steps and language
3. Create and maintain a communications campaign to advance culture and norms

In The Classroom

1. Actively build strong personal relationships between faculty and students
2. Intentionally frame syllabi language reflective of values
3. Explore and discuss possible scenarios and steps to be undertaken by all parties



Proactive approaches should not be compliance oriented, policing, or threatening.



Reflective questions to consider in designing proactive and reactive measures

1. Why do AI violations occur and what does honoring and living the six values look like?
2. What could be seen as violations and why are they considered to be so within the institution's cultural context?
3. What are the responsibilities of all parties to help prevent them?
4. What is the impact (at different institutional levels and on different members of the community) of not honoring the AI values?
5. What role is technology playing to help support AI and how can it be used appropriately by all parties?
